FAMILY HISTORY [FAM.]

Original registers for All Saints, Snodland and Christ Church (formerly Lower Birling) are held at the Study Centre, Civic Centre, Strood, where microfilms of them can be viewed by appointment. Snodland Historical Society is publishing a series of register transcripts: No. 1, the first burial register at Christ Church (1894-1966); No. 2, Baptisms at the Independent [Congregational/United] Church (1836-1907); No. 3, the first cemetery register (1896-1952); No. 4, the complete baptisms (1913-1988) and marriages (1883-1987) at the New Jerusalem Church. **These are on open access.** The Society has photocopies of the registers used in compiling Nos. 2 and 4. The computer holds a database of persons living in Snodland between 1800 and 1901 taken from registers, censuses 1841-1901, and some other documents. This is continuing, but already contains over 17,000 entries (and includes all the information from the registers noted above which the Society has published). **Snodland censuses 1841-1891 are on open access.**
